





10th Annual Forum of the EU Strategy of Baltic Sea Region 12-13th of June, 2019 Gdańsk, Poland

SUMMARY REPORT

Seminar: Close Plastic Tap - Plastic Does not Belong to Environment Time:13 June, 10.45 - 12.15

The seminar belonged to the most interesting among participants - 129 people have registered to take part in plastic discussion.

Our idea was to show the situation from EU, regional and local level as well as give examples of activities taken in BSR.

Thus we've invited panelists from various localizations in Europe: European Environmental Bureau in Brussels, Coalition Clean Baltic in Uppsala/SE, HELCOM in Helsinki/FI, enterpreneur from Jokkmokk/SE. City of Gdańsk was represented by Environmental Dept. Director and Gdańsk Water. Scientific basis of the problem was prepared by cooperating professors of chemistry from Gdańsk University and Technical University of Gdańsk.

Our supporting partner for the seminar agreed to be Gdansk Economic Development Agency (InvestGDA)

The agenda of the seminar was divided into two parts: presentations from the panelists and moderated open discussion with the audience.
